## NO PLACE LIKE HOME TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

The following are answers to questions that were posed by prospective applicants:

1. Can the authorization from the Board be a letter as opposed to a Resolution?

Yes, the President of the Board can sign a letter authorizing a person to submit a proposal on behalf of the agency.

- 2. Is there coordinated entry for transition aged youth (TAY)? Yes, the Coordinated Entry System for adults is designed for adults and transition aged youth (ages 18- 25).
- 3. Can you provide some structure around Phase 2?

Phase 2 would occur after the release of the first NPLH NOFA. Item 1 would focus application development, assistance, and review for projects submitting applications. Items 2 and 3 would be addressed if they don't emerge in the phase one work or need expansion of what emerged.

- 4. Does "Supportive Housing" refer to the County system? Supportive Housing for this scope of work refers to that which is provided or will be provided to the individuals served by BHRS, its nonprofit providers and developers and property owners housing those individuals.
- 5. Is there an existing work group of housing providers that the County seeks input from?

Housing Operations Policy (HOP) is a diverse group of housing, service related providers and consumers that is convened by BHRS to address a variety of housing issues faced by BHRS clientele. There is no formal work group of housing providers but the Department Of Housing seeks input from the providers on relevant issues.

6. Is the Affordable Housing Fund the vehicle for the new funds from Measure K that were approved? Yes.
