




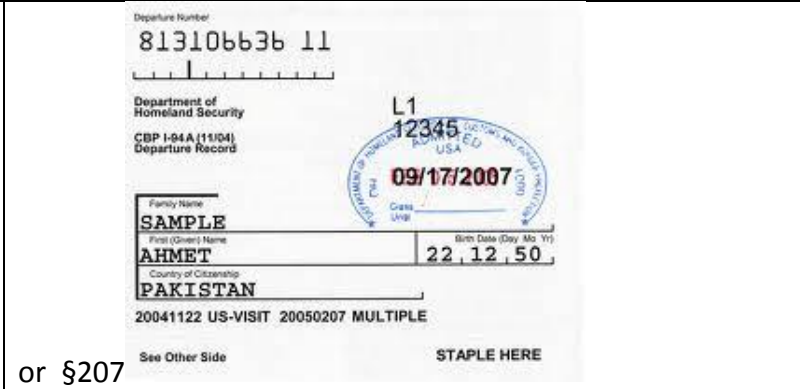
Immigration Documents Commonly Used by Lawfully Present Immigrants eligible for Coverage under the Affordable Care Act (ACA)

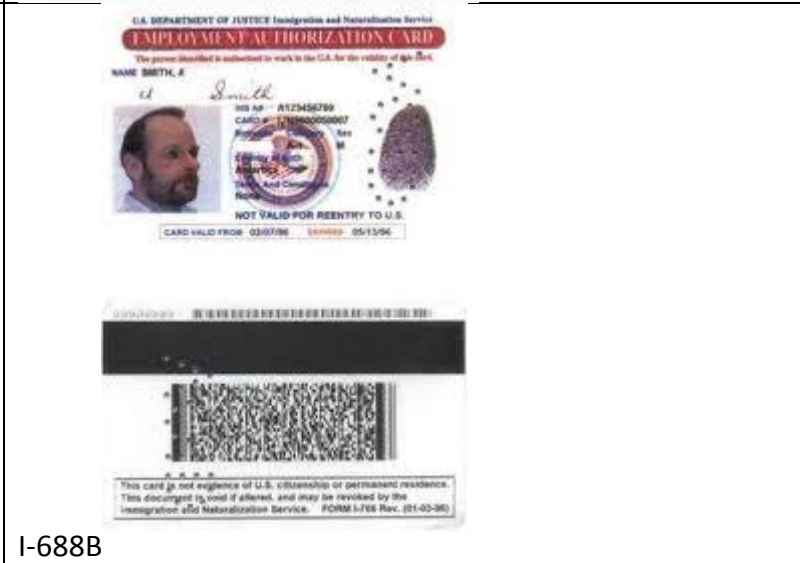

Eligible family members must wait until there is a visa number available before they can apply for an immigrant visa or adjustment of status to a lawful permanent resident. This process will allow USCIS to conduct its resource limit on cases where visas are actually available. This process should not delay the ability of one's relative to apply for an immigrant visa or adjustment of status. If this receipt is for an I-485, or I-498 application
USCIS will schedule your biometrics appointment. You will be receiving a biometrics appointment notice with a specific time, date and place where you will have your fingerprints and/or photos taken. You MUST wait for your biometrics appointment notice prior to going to the ASC for biometrics processing. This receipt notice is NOT your biometrics appointment notice and should not be taken to an ASC for biometrics processing.

WHAT TO BRING TO YOUR BIOMETRICS APPOINTMENT
Please bring your biometrics appointment letter (with specific time, date and place where you will have your fingerprints and/or photo taken) AND your photo identification to your biometrics appointment.

Acceptable kinds of photo identification are:

- a passport or national photo identification issued by your country,

- a state-issued photo identification card.

Always remember to call customer service if you move while your case is pending. If you have a pending I-130 relative petition, also call customer service if you should decide to withdraw your petition or if you become a U.S. citizen.
