

Community Health Planner, Extra-Help

San Mateo County Health, Behavioral Health and Recovery Services (BHRS) is seeking an Extra-Help Community Health Planner to support program coordination and planning of crisis response services and prevention activities across San Mateo County. The Community Health Planner position is an Extra-Help position working 32-40 hours a week through June 30, 2020 to support start-up and infrastructure activities related to youth mental health crisis response and prevention.

Qualifications: Possession of a Master's degree in Public Health, Public Policy, Public Administration, Social Work or other relevant field with relevant experience and knowledge in community health planning is required. Applicants should have personal and/or work experience and passion for programs that advance health equity in behavioral health outcomes of marginalized communities.

Responsibilities may include:

- 1. Training coordination across crisis and suicide prevention trainings including Question Persuade Refer (QPR), Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST), Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) and others:
 - a. Coordinate training requests, logistics, materials and other details for all trainings.
 - b. Collaborate with other training coordinators to develop training schedules, logistics and other details.
 - c. Promote trainings within San Mateo County and to county partners.
 - d. Conduct instructor engagement, support and capacity building.
 - e. Complete QPR, ASIST and other trainings and facilitate when appropriate.
 - f. Ensure all training documents are up to date and adapt training materials and plans when necessary to meet community cultural and language needs.
- 2. Participate in strategic planning and implementation activities of the San Mateo County Suicide Prevention Committee.
- 3. Assist with program evaluation related to youth crisis response and prevention activities.
- 4. Conduct outreach and engagement efforts with schools, community-based organizations and others for crisis response and prevention efforts and programs.
- 5. Position may also support other crisis response service activities, programs and work plans as needed.
