<ol> <li>Call to Order</li> <li>Pledge of Allegiance</li> <li>Roll Call</li> </ol>	Meeting called to order by Chair Lee at 9:02 am followed by reciting of the Pledge of Allegiance led by Commissioner Barr. Roll call conducted and quorum was not established. Commissioners held an informational meeting.
Introduction of members of the public	Ophelie Vico joined virtually as a member of the public and Sandra Lang introduced herself and wished all a Happy New Year.
5. Oral Communications	No oral communications were made.
6. Approval of Today's Agenda; January 8, 2024	Quorum was not established. The agenda was not approved and the Commission held an informational meeting.
7. Approval of Minutes: November 13, 2023	Tabled
Update on BoS activities regarding aging items: Supervisor Canepa	Supervisor Canepa attended and wished everyone a Happy New Year. He thanked Lisa and staff for all their work.

He introduced Kevin Joyner as the staff liaison from his office and emphasized his commitment of prioritizing work with the CoA this year. Supervisor Pine and he are on the Measure K committee. He feels Older Americans are not getting the services they need and wants to know what the Board can do to help fund services and how we can advance the work of the Commission and put dollars behind it.

He asked the following question of the Commission: Where can we improve?

- Commissioner Taylor feels SamTrans is resisting efforts to establish a bus stop at Veterans Village in Colma
- Chairperson Lee is hopeful Measure K support will increase for programs and services for older adults
- Commissioner Giannini stressed the Medical Equpiment Loan program is an important program and needs space for storing and distributing equipment. She also asked when will Measure K decisions be made?

Supervisor Canepa thanked
Commissioners for their comments. He
will have Kevin look into space for the
equipment loan program and projects that
Measure K decisions will be made in
March.

As for other space for the county, COB3 building will soon be ready to open and encourages the Commission to visit.

He also announced the interviews for new Commissioners took place with Supervisor Corzo and he as the interviewers. They focused their



selections on those that presented they would actively attend, engage and contribute to the work of the Commission. They also placed emphasis on diversity.
Chairperson Lee reported the newly elected Executive Committee met last week. She looks forward to working with everyone. The committee discussed starting the year with best practices for Commissioners to follow. 5 best practices were identified. Vice Chair Porter shared the practices:  1. Contact staff before each meeting if you are unable to attend. 2. If you are attending a meeting at 2000 Alameda, please contact Anna or staff to let them know you have arrived, and they will come to accompany you to the meeting room. 3. Actively engage in work of the committee and commission. Many hands make the work light when we share the load. 4. Spell out acronoyms when first used. 5. When representing the Commission, please advocate or present information that is approved by the Commission. If not approved but an important item
for you, please present the item/opinion as a "private citizen/resident."  Chairperson Lee reported that RAIC has completed the major task of updating the Help@Home guide. Special thanks to Commissioner Barsi for leading the work

c. Middle Income Senior Opportunity (MISO) Committee Commissioner Barr reported for Commissioner Austin. The committee is continuing to update their work plan. Focus is on how to connect with faith based communities. She also reported 35% of shelter population are older adults and the committee is discussing housing needs for this population.

d. Transportation and Aging in Community (TAIC) Committee

TAIC: Commissioner Liana reported for Commissioner Uhl. Their last meeting was held in November. They continue making good connections with SamTrans and receiving updates on transportation for older adults. They have released their updated mobility guides which are available for the public. They continue discussing the critical need for transportation especially for seniors who can no longer drive.

The Work plan is being reviewed and the committee has agreed that the items included are broad and are discussing how to update the plan to focus on smaller tangible and achievable goals.

11.Member Reports	Commissioner Giannini asked if there is a waiting list for home delivered meals in RWC. Anna replied increased support is being provided to home delivered meal providers to expand their capacity to provide meals. She asked that the Commissioner talk with our staff to gather more information.
	Commissioner Giannini is also concerned that many businesses are no longer accepting cash in SMC. She asked Supervisor Canepa for his opinion on this trend? The Supervisor replied all stores should accept cash.
	Commissioner Taylor is concerned that cities that received age friendly designation are struggling. Supervisor Canepa replied he would like to work with CoA to gather more information on how the Board can support the work.
	Commissioner Arnos reported on behalf of Commissioner Barsi that they are trying to get a senior day in Pacifica to get businesses to offer discounts and encourage local business to support older adults.
12. Staff Report	Lisa announced that after 40 years working for the county and 20 of those years as Director of Aging and Adult Servces, she will be retiring at the end of March. She thanked the Commission for their dedication and work advocating and supporting the needs of older adults and adults with disabilities.
