HAZARDOUS MATERIALS COMPLIANCE FOR NEW BUSINESSES

Before filling out this form, download it and save to your computer. Fill out the saved version.

San Mateo County Environmental Health Services (SMCEHS) is the Certified Unified Program Agency (CUPA) tasked with permitting and inspecting hazardous materials and hazardous waste businesses in San Mateo County. SMCEHS has also been granted the authority by the State to implement additional programs.

To get started, complete and submit the NEW FACILITY – PERMIT REGISTRATION FORM (Pg. 2). Send it directly to your <u>district inspector</u>, or to Environmental Health Services' office. When received, SMCEHS will process your application and conduct an inspection. Some general criteria are listed below to help identify the type of permit your business requires. Additional resources, forms, and information on fees can be found at smchealth.org/cupa.

CUPA PROGRAMS

Hazardous Waste Generator and Tiered Permitting Programs: Businesses that generate hazardous waste are subject to this inspection program. If a business will be treating hazardous waste on site, additional tiered permitting approval by SMCEHS is required - smchealth.org/tieredpermitting.

Hazardous Materials Business Plan (HMBP) Program: Businesses that have hazardous materials on site may be subject to the HMBP program. If a business has greater than or equal to 55 gallons, 500 pounds, or 200 cubic feet of any hazardous material they are subject to this Program. Requirements include electronic submission of a HMBP using either website - ehesubmit.smchealth.org or cers.calepa.ca.gov.

California Accidental Release Program (CalARP) Businesses which store highly toxic, flammable or explosive materials in quantities greater than listed in state thresholds are also required to be in the CalARP program. To read more about the materials subject to this program, go to smchealth.org/cupa/calarp.

Aboveground Petroleum Storage Tank Program (APSA): Storage of 1,320 or more gallons of liquid petroleum may subject your business to APSA regulations. Businesses in this category are required to prepare and implement a Spill Prevention Control and Counter Measures Program smchealth.org/cupa/ast.

Underground Storage Tank (UST) Program: An application for a permit to operate a UST must be submitted using the websites listed above. Additional forms are required to construct, modify, or remove a UST. Find these and more information on the UST page at **smchealth.org/cupa/ust**.

Waste Tires: Businesses that generate waste tires are inspected by SMCEHS on behalf of CalRecycle. Call (866) 896-0600 or apply here to obtain a tire program ID #: Calrecycle.ca.gov/tires/forms/CalRecycle690.PDF

Stormwater: SMCEHS conducts inspections for unincorporated San Mateo County. Incorporated city areas will be inspected and invoiced by each city. Visit **flowstobay.org** for more information.
