Labeling Requirements

Pursuant to the California Health and Safety Code (Health & Saf. Code) and Title 22, California Code of Regulations (CCR) Section 66262.16(b)(4) for small quantity generators and 66262.17(a)(5) for large quantity generators, each container and which hazardous waste is accumulated (in storage) must be labeled with the following information:

1. *The words "Hazardous Waste"
2. Composition and physical state of the waste
3. *The hazardous waste characteristics (e.g. flammable, toxic). DOT/OSHA acceptable.
4. Name and address of the person generating the waste
5. The date upon which each period of accumulation begins (accumulation start date).

Note: *Tanks may use inventory logs or related records kept available for review.

**For hazardous waste tanks only.*

All labeling information must be clearly marked and visible for inspection on each accumulation unit. In some cases, containers are continuously reused for accumulation of the same waste stream; e.g., drums used to initially accumulate waste which when full are emptied into larger "collection" containers. "Recurring use" labels may be used on such containers to revise the initial accumulation date (without having to change the other labeling information). If the container is emptied at least once each day, the word "daily" may be used in the date area of the label.

The following information can be filled out while waste is stored on site but is not required until waste is transported. (Reference 22 CCR § 66262.32)

1. The words "HAZARDOUS WASTE-State and Federal Law Prohibit Improper Disposal. If found, contact the nearest police or public safety authority, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency or the California Department of Toxic Substances Control."
2. Generator's Name and Address
3. Generator's EPA Identification Number
4. Manifest Tracking Number
5. EPA Hazardous Waste Number(s) - Ex. RCRA Codes like, "D001".

Note: Additional shipping requirements may include marking:

- CA Waste number
- D.O.T Proper shipping name and UN or NA number with prefix (Refer to 49 CFR Part 172).
