	President's Report	<ul> <li>Commissioner Wong attended Community Enrichment Advisory Group at invitation of Director Pullen. Advisory Group is made up of representatives of CoA, CoD, Service providers and is looking at loneliness and isolation.</li> <li>As a member of the public, Chair Wong sent a letter to the Board of Supervisors to ask that they not drop funding for Special Olympics for the 2026-2027 budget.</li> </ul>
5.	Staff Report	<ul> <li>ADS Director Lee Pullen reported:</li> <li>The Community Enrichment Advisory Group convened on 6/24/25 to advise on recommendations regarding loneliness and isolation for older adults and people with disabilities. It will meet 7-8 more times and bring recommendations for opportunities for social connections to the BoS for potential Measure K funding. Committee representation includes: Parks</li> </ul>

	Department, libraries, public health, Commissions on Aging and Disabilities, and soon representatives for economics and volunteerism.  Budget updates:  State IHSS funding outlook improved, for instance there will not be a cap to overtime as was proposed.  Home Safe, a program within Adult Protective Services to help people who are not able to care for themselves, is now likely to continue to be included in the state budget, thanks to advocacy effort.  The Health department budget was presented to the BoS on 6/23/25. There are no plans for reductions. Several new positions for APS and supportive services are pending. For nonprofits receiving Measure K funding, the County can only guarantee first year of funding for this next two-year budget cycle.  Director Pullen likes to meet with new Commissioners, will be meeting with Commission Yoshimine next week; sent an email invitation to others as well.  The new Aging and Disabilities Services canopy will debut at the linguision Feetival.
