History


- Age
- · Location and duration
- Severity (0 10 scale)
- · Past medical history
- Drug allergies and medications
- Fever

Signs and Symptoms

- · Severity (pain scale)
- Quality (e.g., sharp, dull, or stabbing) • Relation to movement or respiration
- Radiation
- Photophobia · Nausea/vomiting


Differential

- Migraine
- Head trauma
- · Intracranial hemorrhage
- · Arterial hypertension
- · Substance use withdrawal
- · Viral/bacterial infection
- Hypoxia
- Hypercapnia

For non-traumatic headache or head pair



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Pearls

- Use judgement in assessing pain and consider circumstances and history of narcotic use before administering narcotics.
- Pain severity (0 10 scale) shall be recorded before and after all BLS pain control measures and ALS pain medication delivery. Monitor blood pressure and respirations closely as pain control medications may cause hypotension or respiratory distress.
- Low flow oxygen can be used to treat cluster-type headaches.
