Syncope/Near Syncope

Signs and Symptoms

Palpitations

· Loss of consciousness with recovery

• Lightheadedness or dizziness

For syncope (transient loss of consciousness). NOT for cardiac arrest; use primary impression Cardiac Arrest – Non-Traumatic only

Differential

Vasovagal


• Cardiac syncope

Treatment Protocol

Orthostatic hypotension

History

- History of cardiac, stroke or seizures
- Occult blood loss (GI or ectopic)
- Females: LMP or vaginal bleeding
- Fluid loss: nausea, vomiting or diarrhea
- Past medical history
- Medications
- Recent air travel



Pearls

• Consider dysrhythmias, GI bleed, ectopic pregnancy, and seizure as possible cause of syncope.



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
