




• Vaccination rates are capped at 95% due to limitations in data precision. County (by age) and County (by race/ethnicity) graphs use different population denominator sources, resulting in different County vaccination rates.

- County (by race/ethnicity) rates are for total population (0 years old and up) for 1+ Dose and Primary Series Complete, but for 5+ population (5 years old and up) for 1st and 2nd booster rates.
- The Health Equity Quartile (HEQ) is comprised of the quartile of County census tracts with the least healthy community conditions, as measured by their Healthy Places Index (HPI 2.0) score.

WHAT'S NEW

- CDC approved Pfizer (12+) and Moderna (18+) bivalent boosters. FDA removed authorization of Pfizer and Moderna monovalent boosters. County clinics will offer bivalent boosters beginning September 12th, as supply allows.*
- CDC approved Novavax for everyone 12+. Novavax is available at most County clinics.*

- CDC recommends vaccination for everyone 6 months+, boosters for everyone 5+, and bivalent boosters for everyone 12+. People who are moderately or severely immunocompromised have specific recommendations. Contact your primary care provider to learn more.
- If you have COVID-19 symptoms and test positive, you may be eligible for treatment. Access Test to Treat (T2T – testing/doctor's visit/medication pick-up all-in-one) through various providers; see https://covid-19-test-to-treat-locatordhhs.hub.arcgis.com/ or call 1-800-232-0233.

Vaccinations, testing, and treatment are available through your doctor, local pharmacies, and County clinics.
