### **CLINICAL PEARLS**

- According to results released in a preprint, non-peer reviewed biorxiv article, the COVID-19 vaccine developed by Pfizer and BioNTech is likely to protect against the fast-spreading "UK variant" of the virus.
   Sera from 16 vaccinated participants in prior clinical trials were exposed to SARS-CoV-2-S pseudoviruses bearing either the Wuhan reference strain or the B.1.1.7 lineage spike protein. The immune sera had equivalent neutralizing titers to both variants.
- According to a paper recently published in <u>Cell</u>, the two signaling molecules IFN-gamma and TNF-alpha work synergistically to cause massive cell death and tissue damage in SARS-CoV-2 infection. These two proinflammatory signals, when administered to mice together, caused the same spectrum of damage seen in critical and lethal COVID-19 cases. Importantly, monoclonal antibody treatments blocking these molecules protected mice with severe SARS-CoV-2 infection from death. These pathways could be viable targets for clinical intervention in the most severe cases and most at-risk patients.
- Pharmaceutical prophylactics, or drugs that are taken to prevent infection, have been a key missing tool in
  the fight against COVID-19. British and Australian researchers have shown in a ferret model
  that administering the TLR2/6 (a sensor protein for invading microbes) activator INNA-051 intranasally
  resulted in over 90% reduction in virus shed from both nose and throat compared to controls. This and
  related strategies, which stimulate a first line of defense against invading pathogens, could help control the
  risk of COVID-19 transmission, especially in high-risk settings like congregate living environments.
