### **CLINICAL PEARL**

- COVID-19 vaccines safety in the general population and pregnant women:
  - As of Feb 28, 2021, 75 million COVID-19 vaccine doses have been administered in the United States.
  - Reactogenicity profiles of mRNA vaccines in <u>v-safe monitoring</u> are consistent with what was observed in clinical trials.
  - Systemic and local reactions are commonly reported to <u>VAERS</u>.
  - o **Anaphylaxis** following both vaccines has been reported to VAERS, though rarely.
  - No other safety signals for serious adverse events have been detected in VAERS.
  - No safety concerns have been identified among the <u>Vaccine Safety Datalink (VSD) Rapid Cycle</u>
     Analysis prespecified outcomes as of February 13, 2021.
  - Pregnant women were not specifically included in preauthorization clinical trials of COVID-19 vaccines.
     Post-authorization safety monitoring and research are the primary ways to obtain safety data on COVID-19 vaccination during pregnancy.
  - Substantial numbers of self-reported pregnant women (>30,000) have registered in v-safe.
  - o So far, the reactogenicity profile and adverse events observed among pregnant women in v-safe is not pointing to any safety problem.
  - Most (73%) reports to VAERS among pregnant women have involved non-pregnancy specific adverse events (e.g., local and systemic reactions).
  - No unexpected pregnancy or infant outcomes have been observed related to COVID-19 vaccination during pregnancy.
  - To date, miscarriage is the most frequently reported pregnancy-specific adverse event to VAERS BUT numbers are within the known background rates based on presumed COVID-19 vaccine doses administered to pregnant women.
  - Safety monitoring in pregnant women is ongoing and planned in v-safe, VAERS, VSD, and the Clinical Immunization Safety Assessment Project (CISA).
