### CLINICAL PEARL

• Data from the NBA's testing program demonstrates that those who continue to test positive for SARS-CoV-2 following initial infection and diagnosis are likely no longer contagious. Published in JAMA Internal Medicine, these data were collected from June 11, 2020, to October 19, 2020 and cover some 4,000 NBA players, staff, and vendors who were required to undergo daily RT-PCR testing and *ad hoc* serological testing for SARS-CoV-2 antibodies. Among the 3,648 individuals who participated, 36 (1%) were persistent positive cases. Antibodies were detected in 33 individuals (91.7%) and all were asymptomatic. Cases were monitored for up to 100 days (51 days on average), during which there were at least 1,480 person-days of direct exposure activities without masks, but there were no transmission events or secondary infections of SARS-CoV-2 detected (0 new cases). These data demonstrate that following the initial infection period, even if people continue to test positive, they are likely not actively infectious.
