CLINICAL PEARL

- Pepcid (famotidine) and COVID-19:
 - Computational methods have identified famotidine as a potential inhibitor of an enzyme that plays a critical role in SARS-CoV-2 viral replication, known as 3-chymotrypsin-like protease. Currently there is very little data available on the outcomes of COVID-19 patients who received famotidine. However, two retrospective studies one conducted in the <u>inpatient setting</u> and the other conducted in <u>outpatients</u> have shown promising results.

PUBLIC HEALTH UPDATES

- The <u>San Mateo County Health Officer Order issued on June 15th</u> extends the provisions of the prior order to continue to slow the spread of COVID-19 and to protect the vulnerable populations residing in any licensed facility that provides residential care in a congregate setting as well as the staff who work there. Facilities should have a COVID-19 Plan in place and should continue to limit visitation.
- The <u>San Mateo County Health Officer Order issued on June 17th</u> allows social bubbles but directs all individuals in the county to limit gatherings to not exceed 50 people and to adhere to social distancing and face covering requirements. It also requires businesses to develop written health and safety plans and to implement a social distancing protocol.
- <u>FDA Revokes Emergency Use Authorization for Chloroquine and Hydroxychloroquine</u>. Based on its ongoing analysis of the EUA and emerging scientific data, the FDA determined that chloroquine and hydroxychloroquine are unlikely to be effective in treating COVID-19. Additionally, in light of ongoing serious cardiac adverse events and other potential serious side effects, the known and potential benefits of chloroquine and hydroxychloroquine no longer outweigh the known and potential risks for the authorized use.
