VISITING RULES ICU, 2AB, 3AB

VISITING HOURS

Monday–Friday, 10AM to 8PM & Saturday–Sunday, 10AM to 4PM

All visits will be limited to 30 minutes at this time.

FOR ALL VISITORS

- **Vaccination is highly recommended;** it is the most effective way of preventing infections, transmission, and outbreaks for you, your loved ones, and our community.
- Visitors must be <u>fully vaccinated</u> against COVID-19. Proof of COVID-19 vaccination must be provided at the hospital entrances. Please show your ID.
 - » "Fully vaccinated" for COVID-19 means: two weeks or more after receiving the second dose of a 2-dose vaccine (Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna) or two weeks or more after receiving a single-dose vaccine (Johnson and Johnson /Janssen).
- If a visitor is <u>not fully vaccinated</u> for COVID-19, proof of negative PCR COVID-19 test taken within 48 hours must be provided before each visit.

PATIENTS WITH COVID-19

- If patient is being treated for COVID-19: visit must be virtual (though Zoom or phone).
- If patient is in critical condition: visitors will be allowed without the vaccination and testing requirements, but must follow the unit's infection control protocols.

WHEN YOU ARRIVE

- All visitors must show their proof of COVID-19 vaccination at the hospital entrances. Please show your ID.
- All visitors will be screened for COVID-19 symptoms and close contact with COVID-19 in the last 14 days prior to entering the hospital AND once they arrive in the unit.
- Visitors must wear a procedure mask at all times (and any other additional PPE that may be required) and perform hand hygiene (use alcohol-based hand rub or disinfecting wipes) before entering hospital AND visitation area.
- Once checked-in at the hospital entrance, you will be directed to the nursing unit—please do not wander around the hospital or unit.

WHILE YOU'RE VISITING

- Visits are limited to one (1) visitor at a time for a maximum of 30 minutes.
- Limited physical contact is subject to additional requirements.
- Children under the age of 18 are not allowed to visit at this time.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- The visitation log will be reviewed regularly to ensure that all residents get a chance to be visited by their family or responsible party.
- Cleaning AND disinfecting of the visitation area will be done by San Mateo Medical Center staff after each visit.
- Visitors who do not follow the Visitation Rules will be asked to leave and/or may not be permitted to visit.
