### **Who are we?**

The San Mateo County HIV Program Community Board is a community planning group, chartered by the San Mateo County Board of Supervisors, to provide input into the prioritization and allocation of resources for HIV/AIDS programs and services in the County. We also provide input to the San Francisco HIV Health Services Planning Council for their prioritization and allocation process.



### **When do we meet?**

The full board meets on the second Wednesday of every quarter at noon (Jan., Apr., July, Oct.). Everyone is invited to attend and lunch is provided.

### **Where do we meet?**

We usually meet at the San Mateo County Health Department, located at 225 37<sup>th</sup> Avenue, San Mateo, 94403.

### **What do we do?**

We support the mission of the San Mateo County HIV Program, which works to prevent HIV infection and cares for individuals and families affected by HIV/AIDS in San Mateo

County. The Program provides comprehensive, community-based prevention and testing services, HIV/AIDS related health care, social services, advocacy, and referrals to community agencies providing drug treatment, housing, in-home care, food, dental care and other services.

Specifically, we provide and solicit community input for the HIV Program and we assist with fundraising for some activities. We participate in the annual HIV Program planning process. We provide community leadership and advocacy on HIV/AIDS issues. And we assist with the review of plans and evaluation of services.

### **Who do we serve?**

We serve people living with HIV and AIDS in San Mateo County, and their families. We focus on serving people with HIV/AIDS who are underserved and people who are at high-risk of contracting HIV.
