Treatment Protocol

Orthostatic hypotension

• Micturition or defecation syncope

Cardiac syncope

• Psychogenic syncope

For syncope (transient loss of consciousness). NOT for cardiac arrest; use primary impression Cardiac Arrest - Non-Traumatic only

Signs and Symptoms

Palpitations

Hypotension


• Pulse irregularity

Loss of consciousness with recovery

Lightheadedness or dizziness

History

- History of cardiac, stroke or seizures
- Occult blood loss
- Females: vaginal bleeding
- Fluid loss: nausea, vomiting or diarrhea
- Past medical history
- Medications
- Recent air travel



• Consider dysrhythmias, GI bleed, and seizure as possible cause of syncope.
