Why do we have an Area Plan?

- To identify needs and address concerns consistent with the Older Americans Act (OAA) at the federal level and the Older Californians Act (OCA) at the state level to enable communities and Area Agencies on Aging (AAA) to plan at the local level
- AAA for San Mateo County- Aging and Adult Services (AAS)





Why do we have an Area Plan Update?

- Area Plan is required by the California Department of Aging (CDA) to receive funding for the OAA programs
- APU is required yearly
- A new Area Plan is required every four years

- Legal Assistance Update







Area Plan Update for Ombudsman Service Unit Plan

- Added FY 2021-2022 baseline numbers and 2023-2024 targets
- Systems Advocacy
 - oIncrease monitoring of open cases to close them in a timely manner
 - Identify and secure funding sources to cover RCFE and SNF costs for residents 85 and over that have spent down their resources and can no longer afford the housing and care they receive



Area Plan Update for Ombudsman Service Unit Plan

• Measures & Targets (data reporting) • Conduct weekly case reviews to improve closing case targets





Area Plan Update for Legal Assistance

Reaching targeted population:

Hire and train staff from ethnic minority communities who have the experience & skill to serve clients with the greatest economic & social needs

- Spanish-speaking Administrative Assistant
- Attorney who can effectively serve the African American community

Title IIIB Supportive Services

Provides a variety of services to address functional limitations, maintain health and independence, and promote access to services.





Title IIIB Adequate Proportions Designations

- <u>Minimum</u> allocation determined by the AAA through the planning process
- Percentages based on needs assessment findings and resources available within the PSA





Title IIIB: Adequate Proportions Percentages

AAS establishes a <u>minimum</u> percentage of Title IIIB federal funds for annual expenditures in:

- Access
- In-Home Services
- Legal Assistance





IIIB Supportive Services Programs

SMC AAS Funded Community-based Programs

- Adult Day Care/Adult Day Health Care
- Information and Assistance
- Transportation
- Legal Services





Proposed Adequate Proportions

- Access- 43% (Transportation and Information and Assistance)
- In-Home Services 45% (Adult Day Care/Adult Day Health Care)
- Legal Assistance- 12%

Program Development & Coordination

AAAs are allowed to use a designated portion of program funding to support PDAC activities that are not administrative duties related to OAA programs

Proposed: 2% (III B)





Program Development Description

Activities:

- Establish a new service
- Expand or integrate existing services





Coordination Description

Involve active participation of AAA staff & May include collaboration with non-OAA funded agencies & organizations to:

- Avoid duplication in services
- Improve services
- Resolve problems related to service delivery
- Address the service needs of the eligible service population
