SCOHR DATA REFERENCE SHEET



Why SCOHR?

SCOHR is a stateapproved, inexpensive, web-based means of collecting and centralizing all required student oral health data to meet the AB 1433 KOHA reporting requirements.



Health Assessment data tracking is crucial to understanding the needs of children's oral health in California, which helps determine intervention strategies.



- 1. Click "Data Input" (top of login page)
- 2. Click "Data Input Form"
- 3. Find the appropriate school
- 4. Enter aggregate data manually
- 5. Email: scohr@sjcoe.net if school is not listed



Deadline is July 1st of school year



- Number of data points to enter: • 20 for manual entry
 - 21 for bulk uploading



ABOUT SCOHR

Use this quick reference guide for entering Kindergarten Oral Health Assessment (KOHA) data into the System for Oral Health Reporting (SCOHR) database. Currently, over 20 data points are required to enter via SCOHR. Listed below are examples of required data points. To view all 20 data points, login to the <u>SCOHR</u> site. If you need support creating a username and password, reach out to your Local Oral Health Program (LOHP).

Two ways to enter aggregate data:

- 1. Manual Entry
- 2. Bulk Upload

Examples of Required Data To Collect:

- Total # of students at the school eligible for assessment (TK, K, first-time 1st graders)
- Total # of students presenting proof of assessment
- Total # of students waived due to financial burden
- Total # of students waived for lack of access to a dentist
- Total # of students waived for non-consent by parents
- Total # of students that did not return proof of assessment or waiver
- Total # of students that found to have untreated decay
- Total # of students that were found to have caries experience

Pro Tip: Skip the Data Entry Errors! Use the KOHA Excel Form

- Automatically double-checks your data entries
- Flags any discrepancies you may have missed
- Generates a summary data visualization perfect for reporting
