YTD: Year to Date. ¹Early Syphilis is defined as primary, secondary, and early latent syphilis stages of disease.

- CT increased 17% in men, and is stable in women compared to last year.
- GC increased 32% in men and 24% in women compared to last year. This is the highest number of male and female GC cases for first quarter reports since 2011.
- Total syphilis cases increased 17% and early syphilis 25% compared to this time last year. For 2017, 8/48 syphilis cases (17%) were female. All 2017 female cases are late latent.
- While specimens tested for HIV decreased 21% compared to last year, HIV cases increased by 5 additional cases. All 2017 HIV cases were identified in other County Clinics. 2017 HIV positive prevalence (0.8%) is slightly higher than 1st qtr 2016 (0.5%).

¹The HIV antibody positives do not reflect the true burden of disease. Some patients may be repeat testers. ²Includes data from Testing on Demand and other STD/HIV program outreach. ³Includes all HIV testing (oral and blood) at San Mateo Medical Center (SMMC), SMMC Satellite Clinics, SMC Public Health Clinics, and PH Subcontractors. Beginning Aug 2015, a 4th generation HIV screening test has been implemented. HIV positive cases may not yet be confirmed by HIV-1/HIV-2 differentiation immunoassay.
