

- Addiction is a medical condition caused by repeated and uncontrolled use of alcohol and drugs.
- Addiction is a life-long disease that can be treated and managed similarly to asthma, high blood pressure or diabetes.
- Addiction does not have a face. This disease can affect ANYONE at ANYTIME regardless of race, gender or age.
- Addiction may be treated and managed in different ways. There are many paths to recover which may include medication, counseling and/or meeting with a recovery coach.
- Addiction recovery is a process, and may involve more than one attempt. Celebrate all accomplishments.




