

Transportation and Aging in Community Committee Notes Date: September 8, 2022; 3:00 – 4:00 pm Virtual meeting via Zoom

The meeting was recorded.

- 1. Committee member Monika Lee called the meeting to order at 3:03 p.m.
- 2. Note taking: Commissioner Lee agreed to take notes
- 3. Public Comment: Lynn Spicer, accessibility coordinator for SamTrans, introduced herself and gave a short overview of the work done by SamTrans and ReddiWheels.
- 4. The agenda for September 8 was reviewed and approved unanimously.
  - a. Commissioner Lee announced that in addition to the listed items a new committee chair needed to be appointed. After discussion, Commissioner Uhl was nominated and she accepted the position.
  - b. Upon request, the new commissioners in attendance introduced themselves, as did Cristina Ugaitafa
  - c. There was a short discussion of the Villages of San Mateo County by Commissioner Liana, and of the Age Friendly initiative by Commissioner Lee
- 5. New Goals and Work Plan discussion
  - a. Detailed discussion was tabled for the next meeting in light of the changes in composition of the committee
- 6. The meeting notes for July 14, 2020, were reviewed and approved unanimously.
- 7. Member Reports
  - a. Commissioner Leth reported on changes being contemplated in SamTrans service on the coast and concerns of residents. She also reported that Half Moon Bay's Age Friendly efforts include plans for a housing workshop and raised the concern that places in the three senior housing complexes on the Coast largely go to people who are not long-time area residents since there are no restrictions on who can apply.
  - b. Commissioner Lee reported on a discussion with Peninsula Volunteer representative Kamilah Najieb-Wachob regarding new funding for their Lyft/Uber program. She also reported on her experience with public transportation in Copenhagen, which has an outstanding system.

- c. Commissioner Uhl reported on her inquiries regarding ADU regulations in Burlingame and noted that building an ADU in Burlingame is not an easy, cheap or quick process.
- 8. New Business there was no separate report of new business.
- 9. The next meeting is scheduled for October 13, 2022. The meeting adjourned at 4:05 p.m.
