CPP Process - Key Highlights


- 1. Input from 29 diverse stakeholder groups
- Pre-launch session with ~ 30 clients/consumers, hosted by the Peer Recovery Collaborative
 - * What to expect, How to provide public comment
- 3. CPP Launch Session with over 120 participants
- 4. Strategy development session with isolated, higher need communities (Coastside and EPA)
- 5. Over 30 follow up meetings with MHSA-funded programs
- 6. Community Prioritization Session with over 150 participants
- 7. Well over 500 participated in the process

CPP Sessions - Participant Demographics

- * 156 demographic forms collected
- * 37% clients and families
